

One aspect of the Thriving Congregations Cohort, which we are in the midst of, is a separate cohort for clergy. The clergy from the fifteen congregations have been broken into three small groups. Each month those small groups gather via zoom with Rev. Derrick Perkins, Sr., Director for Congregational Vitality & Innovation at Disciples Home Missions. Derrick leads the group in reflection about the process, asking questions pertinent to each congregation.

- 2. Bring the Kids: Dress up the little ghosts and goblins and bring them to walk the trunks and collect candy.


