**Praying for how the Spirit is leading is hard to do.** Praying and then waiting for the Spirit's guidance isn't always our cup of tea. Praying and taking the time to listen for direction is challenging. It requires patience. It entails perseverance. It means sitting in the in-between, unknown space, where answers aren't falling from the sky and to-do lists aren't being created. There isn't brainstorming or visioning occurring. There aren't tasks being given. It's all about praying.

So, how are you doing with praying for this faith community? How has it been? Have you stuck with the commitment to pray as the invitation was given three weeks ago? Are you holding space for the members of this faith community, for the activities in the building, for the ministry that is happening? And are you holding space for what may emerge next, for the new possibilities, for the ways our ministry may be expanded and deepened? Are you simply praying?

I encourage you to keep at it because prayer is the first step. We have to open ourselves to the Spirit's leading and see what arises. We have to live a life in response to the Spirit. We have to give it our everything. So, keep praying. Keep lifting up this faith community. Keep seeing the movement that is happening. Keep remaining dedicated to the Spirit. And keep praying throughout the week, especially on Wednesdays at 7pm. We are to be in a state of prayer as one body for this church body.

### Ways to engage in prayer for this faith community:

\*Go through the church directory, praying for every individual listed there.

\*Pray for the various small groups: women's Bible study, men's Bible study, youth group, children's worship and wonder, chimes, quilters, church board, program council, women's ministries and others.

\*Pray for the outreach this church is engaged in.

\*Pray for the staff.

\*Pray for the individuals and groups who enter the church building and grounds.

\*Visually move through each area of the church, stopping to pray for the ministry that occurs in that area and the people who pass through it.

\*Pray with a scripture passage or a particular reading or a song or an image.

\*Pray for possibility and the Spirit moving in ways already known and in ways yet to be discovered.

\*Select a scripture passage (maybe Jeremiah 17:7-8) to use lectio divina with the following steps:

1. Sit quietly and center yourself

2. For the first reading, simply read the passage.

3. For the second reading, read the passage more slowly and listen for the word, phrase or image that stands out.

4. For the third reading, attend to what is going on inside of you when you hear the word, phrase or image that stood out for you.

5. For the fourth and final reading, contemplate the way God is present to you and how God may be leading you in response to what you were paying attention to.

6. Give thanks to God for this time of prayer.



### May 5 Collecting for FISH Food Bank

FISH, our local emergency food bank, needs our donations—non perishable food, hygiene supplies, pet food, and monetary donations (through the Oregon Food Bank, food can be purchased for our food bank at discounted bulk prices and monetary donations go further.)
