Glenn Grannemann went OHSU Vascular Surgery Center for Health & Healing. The wound on his left foot – was checked again & debrided and he is on antibiotics again. On Monday, 11-25-24, he will go to the OHSU surgery center for clearing of a blockage in his lower left leg, so surgeons can have him return to cut out the wound down into the bone in an effort to save his foot. If these two procedures don't take care of it, he will have to have his foot amputated. We pray that these two procedures work. Prayers for healing are

appreciated.



I am now six weeks post surgery. Six weeks of rest, healing and recovery. Six weeks of you all being so gracious to provide me the time and space needed to move in a healing direction. Thank you for that continued gift, grace and understanding. It has been a process indeed. A process where I didn't have all of the answers of how my body and mind would do and I still don't. And I'm still healing on all levels.

My healing and recovery is going to continue as I begin the next steps of treatment. A thanksgiving, I do not have to have chemo. So onto radiation. Next week I will have my initial appointment followed by scheduling my treatments. I believe I will have 20 radiation treatments. Plus I'm continuing physical therapy for some edema in my left arm. Many new doctors and medical staff in a very short period of time. I am thankful for all of them, for the guidance they have provided, for the knowledge they have and for the care they have extended.

This has definitely been a journey. A journey that will continue to have its ups and downs. I am learning to be gracious with myself. I am trying to be patient as I heal. I am working on finding joy and moments to smile. It has been an emotional time that I did not expect. So I am taking steps to be honest about what I'm feeling and then to care for myself. It's not easy and it takes time. Thankfully I continue to be surrounded by God, you all and many family and friends. Here is to more healing. *Alicia*



Building a Brighter Future - MCCAC Newsletter - Fall 2024
Greetings from Mid-Columbia Community Action Council MCCAC! Here are some key highlights from the past few
months:

### **Housing Heroes 2024**

In September we held our 2nd annual Housing Heroes event, coming together over a shared meal and program highlighting our work in the community and local Housing Heroes. Our 2024 Housing Heroes include:

Middy Tilghman and One Community Health's Mobile Medical Unit – Community Partner Award One Community Health's Mobile Medical Unit breaks down barriers to access to healthcare by bringing medical attention directly to those who need it. We are grateful to the Mobile Medical Unit team, led by provider Middy Tilghman, for bringing medical services directly to community members living at The Annex and for working with compassion and empathy to build trust over time so people feel safe to access needed physical and mental health care services.

**Bridges to Health Pathways with the Columbia Gorge Health Council – Community Organization Award** Long before the Gloria Center brought service providers together under one roof, Bridges to Health understood the power of cross-sector collaboration to break down barriers to services for our most underserved community members. We are grateful to work with the team of Community Health Workers at Bridges to Health Pathways and look forward to continuing to deepen our partnership in the future.

**Latasha Harris – Individual Award** As MCCAC's Household Utilities Intake Specialist, Latasha serves our community with pride and compassion, and with a sense of empathy that is hard earned. We recognize Tasha's tireless efforts to assist community members to remain stably housed and her welcoming approach that lifts everyone's spirits along the way.

# The Annex - Celebrating One Year of Serving the Community

The Annex, MCCAC's transitional housing and shelter facility in The Dalles, has now been open for a full year! Over the past year, we have supported over 150 people to transition from unsheltered houselessness into The Annex. Together with community partners, our staff team provides wraparound supportive services to help our clients living at The Annex stabilize. And since last fall, we have supported over 40 people to transition from The Annex into long-term, stable housing placements.

We are grateful to our key partners at The Annex for their commitment to collaboration and a better future for our community. Key partners at The Annex include Nch'i Wana Housing, The Next Door Inc., Mid-Columbia Center for Living, One Community Health, Oregon Human Development Corporation, and Bridges to Health Pathways with the Columbia Gorge Health Council. We are also grateful to the many community members who have shown up to support The Annex by bringing birthday cupcakes and donuts, shoveling snow, donating supplies for the on-site food pantry, and telling us that downtown The Dalles is better with The Annex in it. Thank you so much for your support. Together, we are working toward a future where everyone in our community has a safe and stable place to call home.

### Giving Together - MCCAC's Matching Gift Campaign

We are excited to share that our "Giving Together" matching gift campaign is going on now! # **Volunteer Opportunity – Supporting Emergency Shelter Operations**




