
Lenten theme: Signs to Easter

Lent is a significant 40-day season of spiritual preparation, prayer, fasting, and repentance leading up to Easter, focusing on Jesus's sacrifice and resurrection by commemorating His 40 days of trial in the wilderness. It starts on Ash Wednesday, marked by ashes symbolizing mortality, and traditionally involves the three pillars of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving (charity) to foster self-discipline and draw closer to God, ending before Easter Sunday.

Each circle includes:


- ~ Time for connection and reflection

Second Sunday Recycling reminder


We accept:

Plastics with numbers in the identifying triangles: #1, 2, 4, 5, 6 (include even if number is too small to read)

Plastic film (soft, pliable) Plastic wrappers (non-pliable, like candy wrappers)

Plastic straws Plastic lids Liquid pumps Prescription and
medicine bottles Styrofoam Small electronics—phones, laptops, etc.

We will not collect money to pay for the recycling, as before, because the church's membership in the Project covers the cost.

Tackling Hunger: Join the 2026 Souper Bowl of Caring

The Souper Bowl of Caring began in 1990 with a simple prayer at a South Carolina church; this initiative has raised over \$220 million for local charities since then.
