Ruth Fletcher Workshop, 8-27-2023

Last Sunday after worship and light lunch, ten joined Ruth Fletcher in an hour's workshop about "listening prayer." She distributed this quote from St. John of the Cross: "The exquisite risk is to still our own house." And commentary by Mark Nepo:

> At any moment, if quiet enough and open enough, we can drop into the fabric of existence in which everything, even pain, has its vivid signature or energy that we call, at different times, truth or beauty or peace. The exquisite risk that St. John speaks of is twofold: the risk to still our own house so that the Spirit can come through, so that we might drop into the vital nature of things And the risk to then let that beautiful knowing inform our days. The exquisite risk is a doorway, then, that lets us experience the extraordinary in the ordinary. It is always near. Truth opens it. Love opens it. Humility opens it. And if stubborn, pain will intensify to open it. Sadness can open it, if felt to its center.

Rev. Steve Knox, preaching September 10 & 17

Steve's journey in ministry began with youth ministries at First Christian Church in Junction City (where his father, Gilbert Knox, was Pastor), and Coquille, Oregon. After Bushnell University (NCC), he and his wife Christy moved to Alhambra, California, where he served as Associate Minister. After Fuller Seminary in Pasadena, the family moved to Waitsburg, Washington, his first solo pastorate. Then he served the church in Milton-Freewater, Oregon. And finally, the journey took him and his family to the church in Silverton, Oregon.

The journey included missions to Mexico and Ecuador, youth camps & campouts, a bazillion sermons, weddings, funerals, and hospital calls, much sorrow and much more joy, and a lotta potlucks. He retired in 2020 and continues to enjoy camping, fishing, spoiling his grandkids, and occasional preaching.
