Repairers of the Breach

"...you shall be called the repairer of the breach, the restorer of streets to live in." Isaiah 58:12 NRSV

They came ready to work. The group had come to serve a small community on the South Side of Chicago by lending helping hands to remove trash in open spaces. They also came to learn about the convergence of economic, environmental, and racial justice in this area which houses over 50 landfills. Decades of unregulated toxic waste dumping in this community made it the birthplace of the environmental justice movement. On this day, the group sat at the feet of environmental justice advocates, listening to stories of how their activism resulted in successfully ending the practice of toxic waste dumping in their community. Our group was able to participate in this service-learning opportunity through your faithful generosity. As recipients of a grant from Reconciliation Ministry, the group is committed to apply their learnings in their home communities, to become "repairers of the breach"; restorers of the streets where they and their neighbors reside.

Enduring Honors Continue Enduring Honors Continue

As the finishing touches were applied to the new church, many wonderful gifts given back then are still with us today. From Bob and Mae Jaques at the town church came the communion table, which now stands in the narthex next to Pastor Alicia's office and is used for special worship services.

The original communion table's brass cross and candle holders, which were Valley Christian memorials honoring Ruth Evans, remained in place until the 2011 sanctuary remodel. Some small chairs and classroom cabinets from both of the earlier churches are also still in use today.

The old original Valley Christian church bell was installed on the west lawn of the new building on a free-standing tower built by Elmer Van Blaricom and crew. Over the years, the children would ring it between Sunday school and worship.

Of all the different elements that come together when we worship, where would we be without music? When the congregation moved into the new building, there was a fine large choir under the direction of Betty Foxley with Vivian Getchell as lead organist and assistant organist Peggy Tolson. In the 1980s, a new Rogers organ was installed – and later, a Kawai grand piano was purchased with funds raised from congregational gifts and monies received from the Les Sherwood bequest. Then in 2000, a new keyboard/organ was purchased, and the carillon bells were upgraded with money given in memory of Jim Graves.

Then came a great day of celebration in April of 1975 when Board Chairman Lorn Magnusen led the congregation in burning the mortgage on the 1964 sanctuary/offices/classrooms portion of the new Hood River Valley Christian Church! With momentum from paying off the mortgage early and the desire for a completed church building, a second phase was undertaken. The fundraising effort was led by Dave Burkhart, and Percy Jensen chaired the planning and construction portion. As a result, in 1976, the addition of the fellowship hall, thrift shop, quilting room and storage space was completed.

Our history doesn't end here, though! There's much more to come, so stay tuned as our story continues to unfold!
